Pets will be treated on a first come, first serve basis. Please arrive by 9:30am to help ensure your pet receives care. Please be mindful that check in is first come, first serve while supplies last and time allows. Due to overwhelming demand, we will be limiting clients to two pets per person/family.

<u>Pet Food Pantry</u>—The Pet Food Pantry is open Fridays from 2-4 p.m. at the Center for Humane Education. That building is located on the west side of the NHS campus, behind Walgreens. This pantry can help tide over pet owners who have fallen on hard times. No appointment is needed. Food is distributed free of charge on a first-come, first-served basis.

<u>Project Pet Safe</u>-Provides temporary, safe housing of the companion animals of domestic abuse victims while those individuals work with an advocate to leave an abusive situation. Thanks to generous supporters, we work to arrange free, short term housing for these pets until they can be reunited with their loving owners. *Animeals: Once a month, shelter volunteers load up and deliver free pet food to any senior, with a licensed companion animal, who qualifies for Meals on Wheels.
